As per usual we are taking a break from our street work during January, we find it useful to 'press pause' after the very busy Christmas period where we tend to do extra outreach's, not least to find time to reflect on the past year and firm up planning on the programme for the coming year. I was so pleased to be able to pick up Jane and Alan Hutt from Stanstead airport recently as they return to the UK for their periodic visit to connect with all their Beehive friends and supporting Churches. It's always good to hear about what is going on there in Kenya and I am always struck by the degree of sacrifice that is made by overseas missionaries in their obedience to the Lord, to care for the abused marginalised and downtrodden. Giving up a comfortable western lifestyle to face immense challenges in a culture so very different from our own. We feel very blessed at Street Jesus to be called to support this project and excited for its future as the Beehive family continues to grow and with the imminent securing of Charitable company status the likelihood that it will grow yet more. The purpose? To show the love of Christ, to change lives so that each girl's potential may be truly fulfilled and to help build the kingdom of God here on earth.



We are pleased to hear that the annual 'Crown him with many crowns' event organised by Ipswich in prayer will be running again this year at Colchester Road Baptist church in Ipswich on January 18th 6pm. It is a wonderful evening celebration with speaker and a great opportunity to meet many of the amazing Christian organisations working tirelessly to serve people in Suffolk in a whole variety of ways. We are not sure if Street Jesus will be present at the evening but having been involved before with 'Presence Faith on the street' we know that it is well worth a visit.



Street Jesus News:

As part of our ongoing support for the Beehive we act as a fundraising hub to offer financial support. The Beehive by the grace of God is 100% dependent on fundraisers like us. We will therefore be supporting the main fundraising group by selling African crafts at the upcoming Christina Johnston concert to be held on January 25th at Framlingham college chapel. Christina has such a wonderful operatic voice and was very much enjoyed by the audience at her recent concert at St Augustines church in Ipswich.



At the end of November we attended the Wickham Market Christmas craft fair in the village hall. Although it was one of our quieter events we always say that it is a success for the team just to be out as a public witness for Christ in the community. It was also good to see a craft stall raising funds for a project in Kagera Uganda by selling knitted items. We were also very pleased to be alongside All Saints Church Wickham Market who attracted many people with an Origami display. We just love to work alongside the local church. Most of the Craft stalls are naturally commercial but those stalls that work to help others reveal the humanitarian heart that God has placed in us. £32 was raised for the Beehive and £38.50p for Street Jesus. We would just like to thank Louise Gailey for painting some decorative storage jars to sell for our own funds. This helps us to pay for our pitch fees, literature and chocolates.

In December we enjoyed the Woodbridge Christmas street fair, by contrast to the previous day it was hectic and busy. It was great to have Julia and Peter working with us. We had some great conversations about the nature of the bible, the problem with sin, sex education in schools and the transgender debate as well as heartening stories of healings at Warwick Avenue Evangelical church and significant numbers coming to Christ in Hawaii. We sadly heard about a break in at the Salvation army hall where £1000 had been stolen. Money which was to be used to provide Christmas lunches for those who would otherwise be alone on Christmas day. We pray that this will be replaced with increase. £395 was raised for the Beehive.



Our last outreach before Christmas was also in Wickham Market on the square. We had good conversations through the day learning of somebody who had been clear from Alcohol and its related health problems for 4 years. Encouraging signs for a young person coming out of youth custody and ideas on the nature of Church and where it is located. We also learned of a local Christian Extinction rebellion group and their heart to encourage stewardship of the planet. We enjoyed a very good day and £175 was raised for the Beehive.



Our next outreach will be on Ipswich market on Saturday February 29th further details will appear in our February news. Our bible reading this month is from Mark 10:35-45 and looks at Status, recognition, power and being a slave.

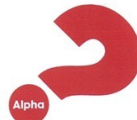

THE VENUE

At the heart of the beautiful Suffolk village of Monks Leigh is an ancient barn, which was converted into a chapel in the 19th century. The recently renovated building is owned by The Ansell Trust and is managed as a Day Retreat Centre by a team from the United Reformed Church and St Peter's Church.



THE VISION

It's a place to find space: time to reflect, to meet, to talk, to be quiet, to recharge batteries, to just 'be'. It's available to everyone, of any faith or none.

Groups or individuals can use it for meetings, retreats, or simply as a base to explore the surrounding area. It's for all who need it, regardless of ability to pay.

THE FACILITIES

There is the main meeting room (seats up to 40) with a small kitchen area (for drinks and plating food), including washing up facilities and linen, along with glasses, crockery and cutlery for 40 people as well as supplies of tea, coffee and sugar. There is also an electronic organ, keyboard and audio-visual equipment available for use. There are 2 toilets, one of which is wheelchair accessible, and there is space for parking at the front of the building and in close proximity.

THE QUIET PLACE

A short walk from the chapel is a five acre area of water meadow, preserved as a haven for wildlife by one of the centre's management team. In line with the vision and ethos of HOME, The Quiet Place is also available to individuals and groups on day retreat. You can follow a special trail with reflections or just stroll and sit and ponder. The distinctive wet meadow ecosystem is a natural home to special species of butterflies, birds and dragonflies.

Then James and John the sons of Zebedee came over and spoke to him. "Teacher" they said "We want you to do us a favour" "What is your request?" he asked.
