It is also good to remember that God put a specific day aside for us to rest for a reason. I mention this because I have recently been reading about clergy who burn out because they try to do almost everything in their church. We need to be aware when we are doing too much. The harvest is great but the workers are few, each worker is precious to God.


I recently attended St Felix church Rendlesham for an outdoor service and


