Welcome to the June edition of our e-news.


Its so great to see all the plans to celebrate the Queens platinum jubilee and I was astounded to see a list of all the Street parties being planned right across Suffolk, it was an enormous list which is quite apart from all the other events that are taking place. Its very good to see our local churches fully engaged in this. As the

generations have passed there has been a diminishing of support for the monarchy with many calling for its abolition, Certainly in many of the former colonies there is a growing call for republicanism. Its right that mature democracies should choose for themselves how they are governed but the Queen represents values which are deemed rather old fashioned by many and yet she has openly expressed how her Christian faith has formed her world view. Even those who don't agree with monarchy are impressed with the Queens



sense of duty and service. In an age where individualism is encouraged our Queen calls us to community instead and this applies not just to our own country but to forming bonds of friendship with so many others in the world. In an age where so many public figures do not or dare not express their faith the Queen routinely does.

I recently attended a Suffolk coastal Filling station meeting at the Riverside centre Stratford St Andrew. The filling station meet every



month usually on the third Thursday. It attracts people from many local churches and is very Holy spirit led. There are refreshments before they start with worship usually led by the wonderful Charity Quinn and a guest speaker of great interest. In May the speaker was the Rev Peter Nicholson who has been involved in the healing ministry for 40 years and spoke very passionately about his experiences, his central message was that

God has given each of us the power and authority to heal. We are held back by a lack of confidence or belief that we are able to in bring healing in Christs name. We had some practical demonstrations as to the approach and a number of people reported pain leaving their bodies. It was exciting to witness and inspired us to put this into practice.

It was great to be able to take the Street Jesus stall to Woodbridge football club for Jamies Funday in aid of the armed forces charity SSAFA. Jamie ably supported by his mum Mandy organise events to raise the issue of PTSD in ex service personnel. Jamie lost his Dad to suicide a few

Years ago. Sometimes young people get a bad press but this young man has a great heart and is a shining example to us all. The centre piecewas a charity football match but there were many stalls there to make people aware of the great work that local organisations are doing. We had a team of eight out We played worship songs for the second time

with Duncan guitar in hand leading the worship. We remember that the believers sang praises in public to God and made music both in the old and new testaments. Its not something we should just confine to the church building. Its always great to see people singing along to our worship songs. Duncan also put the microphone to good use inviting people to come for prayer and healing. We had two ladies who came to speak of their particular health



problems but who declined our offer of prayer. We were very keen to put into practice all that we had learnt at the Filling station. We handed out free chocolates as usual and had the 'Top that' game in operation which many of the children loved. £70 was raised for the Beehive through the sale of African crafts and £13 for Street Jesus. Although we had a quieter day than usual we were able to share together as a group how we saw our development for the future. Sometimes more comes out of these informal chats than in formal meetings.

One of the things we have been talking about is how we can engage with people who have been church goers in the past but no longer



attend for whatever reason or people who are showing curiosity in the faith but have no idea on how to discover more. Listening to the Australian folk band The Seekers on the radio recently I have been humming their song 'I know I'll never find another you' We could certainly say that about Jesus. This ear worm has kept the group in my mind and the word seekers has very much been prominent in my thinking

and in prayer time and we are now taking counsel with other Christians and churches to see how we might best encourage this group of people.

We were very sad to learn that the Woodbridge regatta will not be running this year. Its been so much part of the Woodbridge events calendar since 1836. We have always enjoyed good outreach there and we pray that it is able to go ahead again next year. We are now looking to take the stall out sometime on the last two weekends in June. We are having problems locating an event so may well attend a local car

boot sale or the Ipswich market. Please keep an eye on our facebook page for confirmation.

We are fast approaching Pentecost when we celebrate the appearance of the Holy spirit as we read in the book of Acts The person of the Holy spirit our counsellor and guide who works in us and the world. Whatever we are called do it is by the Holy spirit we are inspired. Let us make the most of the gifts that God has given us. May the holy spirit be with you all







This is an excellent opportunity to join Just42's staff team as a Youth Work Apprentice.

As a long established local charity we offer quality youth and children's work within a Christian ethos. Just42 is committed to the importance of safeguarding and promoting children/young people's welfare.

The Apprentice will be working alongside our team of experienced and qualified Youth Workers across our different youth projects. This will include working in our 4 rural youth clubs, schools work and also our mentoring project. Our clubs and projects offer a safe place for young people to meet their friends, our friendly team are there to lead those projects, provide fun activities and a listening ear for the young people. This is a fantastic opportunity to come and join us to make a difference to local young people!

For safeguarding purposes applicants need to be aged 18 years and over.

Outline Terms

The hours will be 24 hours per week over 4 days and evenings, most of our clubs and projects run during term times only after school. Some flexibility will be needed regarding the weekly schedule. This includes time for "off the job" learning.

The hourly rate will be £7 per hour, as a session worker certain terms will apply - this can be discussed at interview.
