Street Jesus News:

Welcome to the November edition of our e-news. Its been an interesting month in all sorts of ways. We have had time to reflect on our wonderful trip to the Oberammergau passion play in Germany in early September. The passion play has been going since 1634 and apart from a couple of interludes has been performed every 10 years since. In the early 1600's Europe was being ravaged by the Bubonic plague.

The small village in Oberammergau in Bavaria had experienced 80 tragic deaths when the village council pledged to hold a passion play. Amazingly from that point no more deaths took place and as an act of thanksgiving the passion play has been performed. The play having run at a loss for most of its time has grown in popularity to the point where it now breaks even. Interestingly the



participants are often from a long family line of previous actors who tend to play the same character' so Judas for instance would go down the family line. All actors reside in the village. Over 2000 people are involved in the production and although the play is spoken in German it does not detract from the sheer drama and emotion of the performance, besides an English text is available for you to follow. The anguish of Gethsemane and the crucifixion scene were highly dramatic and emotional. If ever you get an opportunity to go (next in 2030) I would recommend it most highly.

We enjoyed a very good outreach at the Framlingham sausage fest on



October 9th The event was well attended and we had a number of conversations about the Beehive. We always say that every outreach is different and although we had less pastoral work and less conversations about God we made a number of connections with other Christians. These are important, to share our

experiences and encourage one another. Its always good to meet up with Christian brothers and sisters we have not seen for a while. £135 was raised for the Beehive, all Good news newspapers were taken, lots of free chocolates given out and Christian literature shared. We met an extraordinary number of dogs on the day including appropriately sausage dogs one of whom was the event mascot being wheeled around in a pram. Perhaps we should take dog biscuits as well as chocolates when we next go out.

We had a very encouraging conversation with a new Christian, born again who gave his life to the Lord last year. He was very enthusiastic and felt he was being called to evangelism. At a time where many churches report less young people in their congregation its great to meet a new young 'on fire' Christian. Some churches however are attracting young people and I remember hearing somebody speaking at Spring harvest telling us about a church in York that was attracting

many young people from the university. The common theme being that their parents were often indifferent to Christianity and that school had provided little of substance in R.E. classes and so there was a

curiosity and openness to explore faith. Often our local village churches lose young people when they go to university so it was very encouraging to hear that University of Suffolk students have been swelling the congregation at River church in Ipswich .Long may it continue.

I have been listening to teachings on the book of Joel, one of the shortest



books in the bible. We tend not to read the minor prophets quite as much as other more substantial books. One of the themes of Joel is repentance and one of the threads we have been exploring is repentance in relation to revival. We often think of repentance merely as a personal thing where we confess our own individual sins but often in the bible the call is more often to repent as a community or nation.



In 2 Chronicles 7 God asks that people humble themselves, pray, seek his face and turn from their wicked ways then he will forgive and restore the land. This suggests that societies are reborn and revived when we repent and pray as a group.

Our next outreach will be the Wickham market Christmas market on Saturday December

3rd. This has been a regular event for us and one which we really enjoy. We have Christmas to look forward to after the increasingly popular Halloween. Both are similar in that there is a very strong commercial element both tend to gravitate around children and the idea of having fun. With regard to Halloween it disguises the fact that

there are dark and evil forces in the powers and principalities At Christmas this is a distraction from the meaning of the season, that God came down to earth in human form to make us right with him. That God is with us in the spiritual battle and that the victory has been won.

We have finished our deliberations regarding the proposed new seekers group. We are interested to share our



faith with those who are curious about God. One of our problems with our street work is that we rarely build up lasting relationships with people as our conversations are relatively brief and often we do not see them again. We pray for them all and hope that God will use others to draw them closer to him. We say that we are a seed sowing operation and we aim to leave everyone who visits us with something to think about but with the seekers group we hope to build longer term bonds with time to share and explore faith. Please pray for us as we venture out. We are reminded in the book of Joel that God will pour out his spirit on all people.

We are seeing a lot of people under pressure right now, the cost of living crisis naturally is creating a lot of anxiety, there is industrial unrest, problems in government and high office and war and social unrest in many countries. It can be very depressing but as Christians we are a people of hope, a people o confidence in our eternal destiny. That Gods plan for the creation will be fulfilled. Lets use every opportunity to share it Blessings Graham

On the weekend of Remembrance, Robin Spittle and All Saints Kesgrave would like to invite you to a special exhibition titled "Kesgrave & District during the two World Wars".

This will also be an ideal opportunity to pop in to say farewell to Robin Spittle and wish him all the best in his retirement.

The Exhibition includes information about Kesgrave's one WW1 casualty, information from the 1939 Register, the evacuation from London to Kesgrave, and the role of local Air Raid Wardens.

A short introductory talk will be given by Robin Spittle on Friday 11th of November at 7.30pm. Before and after the talk there will be an opportunity to look at the exhibits and artefacts, as well as to ask Robin any questions.

A copy of the 1939 Register for Kesgrave, Little Bealings, and Playford will also be available and there will be items of relevance for All Ages. All Visitors are warmly welcomed.


