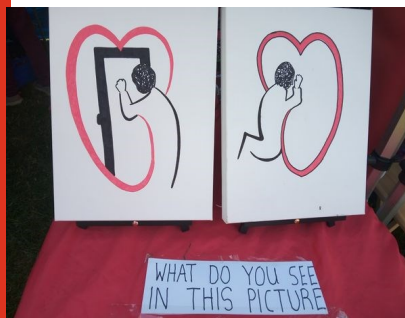

Street Jesus News:

Welcome to the August edition of our e-news.

Jesus told us to go into the world and tell people about him and it was a real joy to be able to do that on our recent outreach to the Ipswich music day. This was the fifth time we have attended this event and it was a very busy day. Thank God for 'Jesus at the door' as we had many people who engaged with the pictures. We had a number of people who felt that they were spiritual by nature and that there was a higher power, there is clearly something inside that yearns to worship or believe in something. We met a young couple who prayed every day but were not sure who they were praying to. They both saw prayer as an act of thankfulness. It put me in mind of the story of a ten year old girl skipping through a field on a bright sunny blue skied day asking, 'Who do I thank' Another couple also said they prayed together before they went to bed each night but had no real concept of the Christian God. We took them through 'Jesus at the door' and they were quite amazed and said that we had given them a lot to go home and think about.



We met others who identified as Christians but did not go to church because they found it difficult to relate to. Although its possible to identify with Christ and not go to Church we do need to accept that Churches and Christians are not perfect. A church can rarely be exactly what we would like it to be and we are there primary to worship God as part of the body. A good church feeds us spiritually, Allows us to

come together in worship of a holy God and support one another to work to support our communities.

We were able to offer a pastoral listening ear to a lady who is estranged from her daughter and grandchildren. We were able to pray with her. Another young man had some interesting theories about the book of Enoch so we were able to talk about the importance of focusing on Jesus as we can soon start getting distracted from the core message. We also spoke to a lady whose close friend had died just two weeks previously and in obvious grief was asking why good people die and bad people seem to live to a ripe old age. Why does God allow such suffering. There is no easy answer to this question. We were able to go through Jesus at the door with her and explain that whatever trials we may suffer in life God is there with us if we want him to be. She is interested in learning more, she took a gospel of Mark and we are hoping to keep contact with her and point her to a local Alpha course. As was the case last year we were able to speak with a muslim man

Which reminded us of a conversation we had with two Young muslim men last year. We were able to have a very polite open conversation about the similarities and differences between Christianity and Islam. It was a model of how we should relate with one another across the interfaith spectrum. Not dumbing down our faith in order not to offend but speak it boldly and in truth. This year was no different, a very respectful conversation we had and Jesus at the door helped enormously to get us to the heart of the Gospel quickly. We focused on aspects of relationship, the love and grace of God as opposed to rules regulations, pillars and rituals in order to win Gods favour. What we receive as Christians is a free gift when we believe in the God we serve.



We also met a man when we were packing up with universalist views. We have heard a lot of these ideas recently. He thought Jesus was a good man, a great teacher but not the only pathway to God. He felt that nature was God and thought it unfair that people who have not had Jesus revealed to them would be denied eternal life. He felt that ethnic religions such as those practiced by indigenous tribes were equally valid. He strongly believed that we would all be re-incarnated. We tried to focus the conversation on the Holy spirit which is a good

connect point for those who express spirituality. The idea that we have a human spirit which is meant to intertwine with Gods Holy spirit, so that we become one with him. We could agree that the kingdom of God is at hand, within touching distance, as close as a decision of the heart. The bible tells us that the only way to the father is through Jesus 'No one comes to the Father except by me'. Yet we are also told that Gods laws are written in our



hearts and that the beauty of nature reveals to us the proof of Gods existence and because of this we should instinctively know that God exists. Whether you believe in an inclusive or exclusive view our job is to share the gospel with everyone. Jesus has given us that responsibility.

We spoke to a stall holder about the need for community rather than focusing on the need to solely make money. We explained that this was very much a part of Jesus teaching. We did have a small number of people who engaged with 'Jesus at the door' but rejected it or just walked away without comment. This rejection of course is part of what we do, just as Jesus was rejected in his day.

We had other interesting conversations. An ex drug addict who gave his life to Jesus and an ex army man who had gone on to run Alpha courses. We also had Christians who were asking questions about meanings in the bible, particularly the book of Job.

We forged good relations with stewards security and all the stalls around including the LGBT one close by. Five boxes of chocolates were given out on the day which were very much appreciated. We took prayer requests on the prayer tree, gave out Christian literature and animal bible verse cards which are always very popular with the children. £63 was taken from the sale of African crafts to benefit the Beehive and we had very many conversations about the Beehive and handed out lots of their leaflets. We enjoyed a truly amazing day to which we give God all the glory. Our next outreach is at the Wickham Market summer market on Saturday August 19th. A huge thankyou to Ipswich borough council for organising such a fine event with an estimated 40,000 people in attendance. See you soon

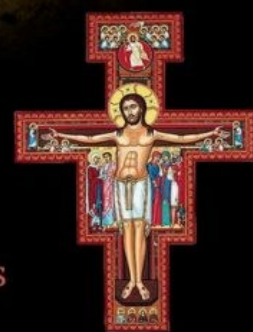

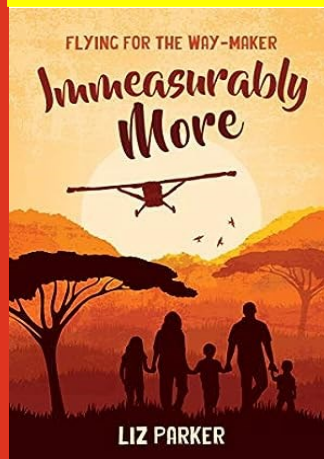

Bible reading

You, therefore, have no excuse, you who pass judgment on someone else, for at whatever point you judge another, you are condemning yourself, because you who pass judgment do the same things. ² Now we know that God's judgment against those who do such things is based on truth. ³ So when you, a mere human being, pass judgment on them and yet do the same things, do you think you will escape God's judgment? ⁴ Or do you show contempt for the riches of his kindness, forbearance and patience, not realizing that God's kindness is intended to lead you to repentance? But because of your stubbornness and your unrepentant heart, you are storing up wrath against yourself for the day of God's wrath, when his righteous judgment will be revealed. ⁶ God "will repay each person according to what they have done." ⁷ To those who by persistence in doing good seek glory, honor and immortality, he will give eternal life. ⁸ But for those who are self-seeking and who reject the truth and follow evil, there will be wrath and anger. ⁹ There will be trouble and distress for every human being who does evil: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile; ¹⁰ but glory, honor and peace for everyone who does good: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile. ¹¹ For God does not show favoritism. ¹² All who sin apart from the law will also perish apart from the law, and all who sin under the law will be judged by the law. ¹³ For it is not those who hear the law who are righteous in God's sight, but it is those who obey the law who will be declared righteous. ¹⁴ (Indeed, when Gentiles, who do not have the law, do by nature things required by the law, they are a law for themselves, even though they do not have the law. ¹⁵ They show that the requirements of the law are written on their hearts, their consciences also bearing witness, and their thoughts sometimes accusing them and at other times even defending them.) ¹⁶ This will take place on the day when God judges people's secrets through Jesus Christ, as my gospel declares.
