My favourite is a quiz game called When? which entails an element of bluff and is centred around events (often trivial) in history. During the course of compiling thousands of questions for this Game I have developed a real love of history, I find it fascinating how the past informs both the present and the future. History

for example is so apparent in the Black lives matter campaign, where there is a move to recalibrate history to consider individuals who were involved in the slave trade. There is always a debate about whether humanity is better or worse morally now than in previous times. For every person who thinks that we are going to hell in a handcart there are others who think that we look at previous generations through rose tinted spectacles, that there has never ever been a golden age.

I have spent a bit of time looking at Christian history and recently came across a book by Carl R Trueman that looks at the rise and triumph of the modern self, how we have developed

over the centuries into a more individualistic, permissive ,sexualised and identity driven culture and where the origins of these changes are rooted in events many centuries ago. Our Christian history is intertwined with secular and humanist history but this book is clear that we live in an age of spiritual poverty. When we compare the teachings of Jesus and the cultural messages that we are bombarded with every day we can see clearly which better leads to human flourishing. The call to agape love and selfless service or the call to satisfy ourselves. So whether we are better or worse than previous generations is not the issue but rather how do we share the person of Jesus Christ so that all may be spiritually fulfilled.

My wife Barbara is a great lover of walking, while I am a great lover of curling up on the sofa with a good book, so while I am reading about our cultural history Barbara has been walking many miles each day as she has been on holiday. Recent mental health advice has highlighted the importance of exercise and walking in particular as it allows us time to absorb the environment which we would otherwise whizz by. She has also been reading a book entitled 'The way under our feet - The spirituality of walking'. Although there was not much in the way of alternatives Jesus spent a great deal of his time on foot. Many miles through village after village, He was able to communicate with people directly, healing disease and preaching the kingdom. We miss so much personal contact in modern life as the cars in which we are transported rush by the detail of Gods wonderful creation as well as many people who we might otherwise have engaged with. As technology develops so many things become more distant, our banking, supermarket checkouts and automated telephone systems all reduce person to person contact. And more is yet to come with the event of artificial intelligence. Yet we are made for relationship, the godhead Father son and holy spirit are in relationship with one another and us. Walking around in our communities we too can have more time to form relationships.



With the event of Covid there seems to be an upswell in prophesy on line, particularly in relation to the end times. Our bible reading this month is from the book of Jeremiah warning about prophesy, which can be false and centred around peoples own personal agendas. Many are claiming for example that God has told them that people should not take the covid vaccine. So how should we respond? Firstly we know that there are such people as prophets and much time is dedicated in some Christian circles to prophetic ministry. We need to be open to prophetic messages from God particularly as they often come in the shape of warnings or exhortations. . But how do we know when a prophesy is genuine? The Bible really gives us the answers. Firstly prophesies are to be consistent with scripture. We would not believe a prophet for example if they said that God wanted us to harm our neighbour. We are also told that we are to test prophesy, that is share it with other Christians and pray together as to its authenticity. Is it from God or is it just something of our own imagination? Prophesy almost always were warnings, usually with regard to Godless behaviour but also instructions. Not many Christians have the gift of prophesy because we know that God has given us different gifts and callings. Whatever we have been given by Gods grace is to benefit the body of Christ and Gods kingdom. There is always speculation about when Jesus will return but in truth the bible tells us it will be sudden and unexpected, we will not know the hour but like the five wise virgins we are to keep oil in our lamps. We are to keep the light of the Lord shining in us. So regardless of any prophesy that may come our way we need to be ready.



It's been very encouraging to see the amazing speed at which the covid vaccine has been rolled out. Already we are seeing a significant reduction in cases, hospitalisations and deaths. Once the lockdown measures allow we will be calling a meeting with the intention of restarting our Street ministry. It will be so good to get out there again, we have really missed being able to show the love of the Lord out on the street. The pandemic has taught us how fragile we are. 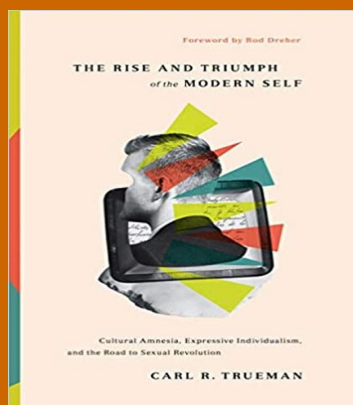

Bible reading

“Therefore” says the Lord “I am against these prophets who steal messages from each other but claim they are from me. I am against these smooth tongued prophets who say this prophesy is from the Lord. I am against these false prophets. Their imaginary dreams are flagrant lies that lead my people into sin. I did not send or appoint them and they have no message at all for my people. I the Lord have spoken

Suppose one of the people or one of the prophets or priests asks you ‘What prophesy has the Lord burdened you with now? You must reply ‘You are the burden’ The Lord says he will abandon you! If any priest prophet or anyone else says ‘I have a prophesy from the Lord I will punish that person along with his entire family. You should keep asking ‘What is the Lords answer ? Or what is the Lord saying.? But stop using the phrase ‘prophesy from the Lord’ For people are using it to give authority to their own ideas, turning upside down the words of our God, the living God, the Lord of heavens armies. This is what you should say to the prophets ‘What is the Lords answer? Or what is the Lord saying. But suppose they respond ‘This is a prophesy from the Lord! Then you should say ‘This is what the Lord says. Because you have used this phrase “prophesy from the Lord” even though I warned you not to use it. I will forget you completely, I will expel you from my presence along with this city that I gave to your ancestors. And I will make you an object of ridicule and your name will be infamous throughout the ages .
