Welcome to the January edition of our e-news.

We hope you have all had a very enjoyable Christmas and as we look to the new year we resolve to put into action that which Jesus came to earth for, to point people to Jesus and to love others to the glory of his kingdom. It is with sadness that we hear of the death of Bishop Desmond Tutu. I have read some reports on social media that have

questioned his theology but there is no doubt that his love of Christ led him to stand up for social justice, not just in the fight against Apartied but for the poor oppressed and marginalised in general. He cried tears of real sadness and laughed real tears of joy. Anyone who met him was truly inspired by him and he was a great encouragement to others. The encouragement of our brothers and sisters in



whatever area of work we are called to do is so important.

We very much enjoyed our outreach at the Wickham Market Christmas market. It was a great day. £250 was raised for the Beehive and £22for the Street Jesus coffers. We had a new range of bird nesting boxes donated by Ken Scott which were very popular. We gave out all our bibles and good news newspapers, some Gideon new testaments and psalms as well as other Christian literature. We had a number of conversations two of which were very Jesus focused and



interesting. We have prayed for all those we engaged with. Unusually we had no prayer requests or pastoral issues. Each outreach is so very different and we never know what God is going to place before us on any given day. The free chocolates went down well as usual and our free Christmas music CD's were all snapped up. We had some great feedback from the organisers and the event was certainly very well organised. It was great to have All Saints church nearby with

their stall some of whom dressed up in nativity costumes. Our next outreach will be in March with details to follow.

We have had some interest in the discipleship course we are hoping to run in the new year and although primarily for team members we would welcome anybody who is interested in this subject. We remember

when this project was first laid on our hearts we had no real idea on how to proceed with street evangelism, there was no place that we were aware of who could disciple us.


Conversatrions but we know of course these are not just random and although we felt fortunate that we 'stumbled' across a group called

Presence -Faith on the street who worked in Ipswich we also knew that God was giving us the resources we needed. Working with experienced evangelists gave us confidence to step out. This course is designed to help those who are engaged with or feel called to go out on the street as well as those with a general interest in discipleship. We are learning



all the time on how best to approach certain situations, how best to share the love of Christ. We mention this because a couple of people I have spoken torecently felt they wanted to come out and do street work but felt nervous and ill equipped.

We recently had a talk in Church about how the people in biblical times



were deemed somewhat ignorant or backward compared to people today and yet those earl civilisations made great progress in all sorts of areas. Some dismiss the bible as being written by primitives thus not worthy of consideration. Technical advances have been incredible in recent years to the point where we have recently launched the most

powerful telescope into space. This telescope has a range of around 1 million miles and its quest is to explore distant parts of space and collect light from distant galaxies to better understand how the universe came into being. The cost is around 30 million dollars and many ask the question—could this money be put to better use to tackle extreme poverty in the world. Mankind is still building it tower of babel. As Christians we know that God created the heavens and the earth so this quest is futile, there is no scientific unified Theory of everything and we believe that our existence and purpose is better explained by the spiritual rather than the material.

As we pass the shortest day and the longest period of darkness we reach that time again where we look to a new year with renewed hope and optimism. Resolutions are made and often broken because our will

is not always strong and although we are weak our God isn't. He is almighty and powerful and we know that whatever strength we may have, in truth it is given us as a gift of grace from God to whom we give all the glory. Our resolutions should be a daily rather than a yearly pledge, to draw closer to God



and to share his love with all whom we come across in our daily lives. Let us pray for that energy and strength and let our light shine even in the darkest of days

One of the recurring themes on our facebook page is comment about people in the public eye who declare their faith in God. They seem to get a lot of criticism from other Christians either that their theology is wrong or their behaviour is un-Christlike. We tend to publish these articles at Street Jesus because to have celebrities declaring for Christ in the public arena is a positive thing in a world which increasingly rejects the whole idea of God. We are all on a journey of growing close to God and we know that God is working in people even before the point of being born again. Celebrities endure extreme scrutiny to which most of us are not. 
