Welcome to the May edition of our e-news. Following a lovely Easter weekend in my own fellowship here at Wickham market from the March of witness, to the Good Friday reflective service and the joy of Easter Sunday we went on to Spring Harvest in Minehead. Its something we so look forward to each year and we were not at all

disappointed. The theme this year was Flipped to demonstrate life in the upside down kingdom of God. A kingdom rooted in grace mercy and forgiveness. The teaching centred around the beatitudes and the sermon on the mount found in Matthews gospel. The main bible study in the large studio 36 venue were led by John Swinton who covered the 'thinking



it through' part and Rachel Gardner the 'working it out' section. . Each in turn brought a gentle humour and enthusiasm to the subject. The teaching was of very high quality as they forensically picked apart each passage. Other speakers included Danielle Strickland, Sharon Prentis, and Dez Brown who shared a remarkable testimony. Leon Evans provided a rousing and humorous rallying cry on the final



morning. There were a huge number of resources as normal. Malcolm Duncan wrote the Flipped theme book with Beatrice Smith writing the beatitudes workbook. Essential Christian had a huge display of Christian books in the Skyline which are always very popular for us bookworms. The evening worship took place in a number of venues with Lou Fellingham leading in the main studio 36

venue. As uplifting as always. How often do you get to worship with thousands of other Christians in one place. There were a large number of seminars to choose from throughout each day so it was difficult to choose which ones to go to, so many interesting subjects. As usual there was a focus on the work of a number of Christian organisations including Compassion, Home for good and Care for the

family. There were a number of activities aimed at young children and youth. The Big start each morning was a lot of fun. A series of sketches that contrasted King Me with King Jesus. The three muck maids were tasked with persuading King Me to follow King Jesus, to serve rather than be waited on by others. They just about succeeded on the final morning after lots of song, dance and a bit of slap stick. The



children loved it and everybody got into the spirit of it by dressing up as Kings and Jesters. There is a terrific family atmosphere at the big start despite it being a bit early in the day for us sluggish ones.

Spring Harvest has a very special atmosphere, a community of very diverse people and where people are cared for.

This consideration of others was seen in simple things like exiting in the car parks after the event. Everybody was polite allowing one another to go first. I contrasted this with exiting the Portman road car park after a recent football match where cars try to nudge in front of one another with many not giving an inch and getting

perilously close to damaging other cars. After being in a Christian bubble for a few days some aspects of our culture seem harsh when we return to 'real life'.

On the subject of 'Me' I recently came upon a book by Matthew P.W.Roberts titled 'Pride, Identity and the worship of self'. This is a critique of recent cultural changes which tends to be individualistic



and centres on identity, self worship and pride which are seen by Matthew as new forms of idolatry. This is contrasted with the Christ life. The front cover depicts Narcissus looking at his own reflection in the water. Its an interesting book that looks at this particular trend in our society and applies Gods teachings to it. This is why the need to share the gospel is most important. Our identity is in Christ alone.



We will be out sharing the gospel at Trinity Park car boot sale this coming Sunday 30th April and at the Lions car boot sale on Cavendish park Felixstowe. On Saturday 13th. We will again be using the Jesus at the door approach and selling crafts for the Beehive childrens foundation in Kenya. Please do come and visit us.

Our seekers group is up and running and we still have spaces available for those who are curious about the Christian faith. If you know of anybody who may be interested and would benefit please let me know. Its been very interesting. The first week we asked' What is the purpose of life and what is the purpose of religion' to get us started off. After the first session we asked what subject they would like to cover and the answer we got was the Theory of Evolution in comparison to the seven day creation. This was followed by 'Is the

Bible relevant. We felt it was important to ask group members what subjects they wanted to cover rather than a set programme as you might get in some Christian courses. Our subject for the upcoming week is 'Who is Jesus'. A few years ago as a new and enthusiastic Christian (Aged 50) I embarked on a period of learning, I felt like a spiritual sponge and I wanted to be as prepared as



I could before going out on the street. I had read the New Atheists and their critique of Christianity so to collect my thoughts I wrote a rebuttal of their views in a number of papers on various subjects under the title. 'Critique culturee and Christ'. I had thought that we could use these on the street and at events to give out. At the time it was felt that they were maybe a little too in depth so we went with the Alpha Why Jesus booklets instead. At the time it seemed like wasted work but how useful they have been to help prepare for our Seekers group sessions. It just shows that nothing is wasted in Gods kingdom. We do some work for one thing not realising it will be used for something completely different. As we look forward now to Pentecost to celebrate the coming of the holy spirit let us all seek the spirit of God to help us in our daily endeavours. Blessings Graham
