Welcome to the 100th edition of our e-news.

It is a little over eight years now since we published our very first e-news. We had no idea then how it would develop or how long it would last. The original idea was birthed at one of our Street Jesus meetings just one year after the project started. We have produced it every month since that time apart from a couple of months due to

illness. The first issue consisted of just two pages but has grown to over twenty pages most months. I am constantly amazed at how much goes on in the local Christian community and it truly gladdens my heart. Right from the beginning we wanted to work alongside Churches to go out into the public space to share the love of God and convey the good news of Jesus Christ. In the process we got to meet many Christians from different churches and we noticed that we were not always aware of what was going on in our own local



Christian community. The idea was to inform people of what we were doing as a group but also to gather and share information of what was going on in other Churches. Its very easy to get stuck in our own church bubble and not be aware of what's going on locally. We have had so many people over the years thank us for making them aware of an event which they enjoyed and which helped them in their faith journey. Our hope is that this sharing will continue to help strengthen



not just individual Christians but also the local church.. There is a wide range of information contained within the news that go beyond events which we hope you have found useful. In many ways our facebook page reaches more people but we are aware that not everyone is on facebook so e-news certainly still has its place. In that time Network Suffolk has been developed as a very good source of whats going on

across Suffolk and has considerable reach across the county. We thank you all for supporting us.

We have learned in recent times how much we rely on Evangeline the Street Jesus van. It recently suffered from multiple problems beginning in May which required a 14 week wait for parts which was

followed up by three further problems. Vehicles are so complex now, very technical and there is so much more to go wrong and when they do the parts are much more expensive. This disrupted our mission to help out families with inexpensive tip runs and house clearances at a time when removing stuff for recycling has become increasingly expensive. We had to cancel our



village hall sale where normally 50% of proceeds are donated to the Beehive

Street Jesus News:

Our recent outreach at Trinity park was very good. We had four out on team and we had a number of interesting conversations and once again we had significant engagement with 'Jesus at the door' We had one young man with his son who were very interested in what we were

sharing. He was very taken with the sin stones in the rucksack and how Jesus takes our burdens. He spoke of problems in his own life and we were able to talk about how Jesus heals us. Another man engaged at a distance, quite liked the idea of Jesus coming into our hearts but when we moved on to the bag of sins he made his apologies



and was gone. Completely different responses to the same information. In our church recently Jenny gave a demonstration with two tumblers one turned upside down. Asking us to imagine pouring water over the two tumblers. One is open to being poured into the other isn't. The water represents the word of God and the holy spirit and the people who visit us broadly fall into those two groups. We look and pray particularly for those who are open to come. That's not to say we are not interested in those whose tumbler is upside down because we bless all those who visit and we hope that either through what we say or how



we are that they may become more open to receiving the living waters. Things change over time and I know that for many years I was a tumbler turned upside down, the water ran off me as if off a ducks back.

We prayed for a lady with severe osteo arthritis and gave pastoral support for another lady whose husband is in a wheelchair who had had a stroke and whose son suffers with Crohn's disease

We spoke to a Christian man who had been living in the area for a couple of years but could not

find a church he could settle into. We encouraged him to persist and to seek Gods purpose for his life.

Another lady believed in God but worshipped him in her own way and could not relate to Church. We hear this quite a lot on the street, it's a kind of individualised faith but truly there is no other way than to worship in spirit and in truth. We gave away free bibles and New

testaments and psalms and a number of Beehive leaflets and other Christian literature. A total of £22 was raised for the Beehive Childrens foundation. Our next outreach is at Friday Street car boot sale Farnham. On Sunday October 15th

Christian friends have recently been urging me to write more. Early in my Christian faith

i was given a picture of a pen and an editors hat and I have always sensed that at some point God wanted me to pen something substantial. The Street Jesus project will be ten years old next year and it maybe that I will write sometime about our experiences of our 100 plus outreaches to date. I have also had seasons where I have submitted letters to the East Anglian daily times on cultural and Christian matters. I am entering that season again now having had letters published recently on Suffering, thanksgiving and Justice. God wants us to speak into our culture in whatever way we can, be that getting alongside people on a one to one basis or doing something more public. Its interesting how God prompts us to do different things at different times and wants us to use our gifts. What is you gift? Blessings to you all Graham
